NON-SURGICAL FACE-LIFTS

Can a low-voltage electric current really stop your face and body 'travelling south'?

As we get older, our face and body start drifting downwards. Since the concept of non-surgical face-lifts hit the market some two decades ago, we've seen a raft of different technologies launched, all claiming to reverse that downward droop. Most have hit the rocks within a short time. One salon treatment, however, has stayed way out in front: CACI – the Computer Aided Cosmetology Instrument, now updated to CACI Quantum. This is the one that we (and other beauty editors) recommend.

Pioneered for medical use, CACI Quantum works by an electrical current introduced to specific points on your face through cotton-tipped probes. The current kick-starts flagging

muscles and the fibres responsible for the tone and elasticity of your skin.

The effect is noticeable immediately: sags and bags are reduced, lines and wrinkles softened, and there is a real impression of a face- and neck-lift, albeit a temporary one. It's best within 24 to 48 hours, although you may still see some effect after a week. Additionally, it can be programmed to work on the body, for stretch marks, cellulite and also bust enhancement.

Ten to 15 treatments are recommended, with maintenance treatments every four to six weeks thereafter. But do remember, results will depend on your individual situation. If you're a twenty- or thirty-something with good skin, you may notice little change. For others, it may take longer to see a real change, and upkeep may need to be more frequent.
